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Overnight Closures of Last S.F. Exit Just Before Golden Gate Bridge Toll Plaza

Wednesday, November 16 and Thursday, November 17 from 10 p.m. – 5 a.m.

SAN FRANCISCO – There will be two overnight closures of the last northbound exit just before the Golden Gate Bridge Toll Plaza on Wednesday, November 16 and Thursday, November 17, from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. the next morning. These ramp closures are part of a roadway project to improve the off-ramp and the intersection at the Southeast Visitor Plaza area.

Drivers should use local roads to access Lincoln Boulevard.

This project is expected to last approximately three weeks. There will be additional ramp closures at the conclusion of the project to repave the off-ramp. The dates for these closures will be announced when they are confirmed.

The closures were scheduled for a time when traffic volumes are lowest.

Southeast Visitor Plaza Improvements

These ramp closures are part of a project to improve traffic and safety conditions around the Southeast Visitor Plaza/Lincoln Boulevard/Merchant Road intersection and help alleviate congestion during construction. Work will include:

- Implementing an all-way stop at the Merchant Rd./Lincoln Blvd. intersection to improve the operation of the intersection.
- Removing and reconstructing the center median island on Merchant Rd., widening the roadway and restriping to create two lanes in each direction, increasing storage and intersection capacity.
- Widening the northbound Highway 101 off ramp in order to create separate left and right turn lanes.

This project is being conducted in cooperation with the Golden Gate Bridge Highway and Transportation District, National Park Service, and Presidio Trust.

About The Presidio Parkway Project

The replacement of Doyle Drive with the Presidio Parkway is a collaborative effort led by the California Department of Transportation and the San Francisco County Transportation Authority.

Doyle Drive is the portion of Route 101 located within the Presidio of San Francisco that winds 1.5 miles along the northern edge of San Francisco and connects the San Francisco peninsula to the Golden Gate Bridge and the North Bay. Each weekday, more than 100,000 vehicles travel between Marin and San Francisco over the Golden Gate Bridge along Doyle Drive.

Doyle Drive is structurally and seismically deficient and must be replaced. The roadway is facing the same problem that threatens other crucial components of the nation's infrastructure - the ravages of time and continual use. Originally built in 1936, Doyle Drive has reached the end of its useful life. The new Presidio Parkway replacement is based on a world-class design that will improve the seismic, structural and traffic safety of the roadway. It also will be far more sensitive to community needs and to the national park setting, reducing impacts on biological, cultural, historical and natural resources and on the surrounding neighborhoods.
